The former Celestine Frances Peplinski was born April 2, 1927, in Winona, Minn., to the late Peter and Catherine (Glowacki) Peplinski. She grew up on the family farm in Trempealeau County. Prior to entering the convent in Stevens Point on Aug. 29, 1947, she was employed as a secretary at the courthouse in Winona.

On Aug. 10, 1955, she professed her perpetual vows as a Sister of St. Joseph of the Third Order of St. Francis.

Sister Damian earned a B.S. Ed from St. Norbert College in De Pere, an M Ed from Marquette University, and an Advanced Certification in Catechesis from the Diocese of La Crosse. She was an educator for 35 years in Catholic schools in Wisconsin. In the Diocese of La Crosse she served as teacher/principal at St. Peter and St. Stanislaus, Stevens Point; St. Pius X, La Crosse; Sacred Heart, Cashton; St. Francis, Ellsworth; Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Stanislaus and Holy Family in Arcadia.
